## **BERT BRINK SCHOLARSHIP**

BC Nature will award one \$2,500 scholarship in the summer of 2024 to a student registered in full-time studies towards a post graduate degree at an accredited BC institution of higher learning in a program which will lead to a Master's or Doctoral Degree. The discipline should contribute to an awareness, appreciation, improved management of flora and fauna, conservation, restoration and understanding of our natural environment.

Applications will be judged on the relevance of the academic program as it pertains to the legacy of Dr. Vernon Cuthbert (Bert) Brink. In particular, grasslands, estuaries, and Fraser River lowlands. Criteria also include undergraduate marks showing sustained academic excellence in relevant subject areas; reference's evaluation of applicant; their background in natural history, conservation and environmental issues and their connection and involvement with nature through volunteer activities that promote "knowing nature and keeping nature worth knowing," by increasing awareness, appreciation and understanding of nature activities related to habitat conservation.

All scholarship applicants will be awarded a <u>one-year</u> direct membership to BC Nature and will receive a digital BC Nature magazine four times a year. With the membership, applicants are eligible to attend any BC Nature events, join committees, and vote at general meetings. The scholarship will be awarded only once to a student; a previous award recipient will not be considered.
